## Staying healthy

As mentioned in another blog, I love Dave Brailsford, now Sir DB's, idea of marginal gains.

With British Cycling he took every aspect of cycling from biomechanics to diet to helmets and broke them down to their component parts.

He then worked on each to develop a marginal improvement. It might only be a fraction of a percent in improvement of times achieved. But when all of these marginal gains were amalgamated the whole was improved to a remarkable degree.

I thought it was time to look at marginal gains that can be made in our health prospects.

If we look at the major causes of illness there are several things we can do that, when added together can make a significant difference.

I did a previous blog on the benefits of exercise (http://www.privategphealthcare.com/23-half-hours-wonder-drug/). This discussed the marked reduction in heart attacks, depression, dementia, arthritis and blood pressure with even small amounts

of exercise. Even 10-30minutes of walking a day (the more the better result) markedly reduced blood pressure and a daily exercise programme with a once weekly group exercise session was more effective than inserting a coronary stent, in reducing cardiac events (angina or heart attack).


Stopping smoking has a marked impact on a whole range of illnesses including heart disease, stroke, vascular disease including leg ulcers, respiratory disease and a whole range of cancers. Your life expectancy will be greater, and you'll notice an improvement in the symptoms of smoking related diseases such as Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD). In addition, you will be financially better off and get a return of taste and smell.

Drinking less alcohol will reduce your risk of developing serious health issues such as cancer, liver or heart disease and can contribute to lowering your blood pressure. Significant alcohol consumption has a marked impact on mental health, causing depression and anxiety. Alcohol also affects sleep significantly, reducing sleep quality.

Reducing cholesterol levels, either with lifestyle or statins has a marked impact on reducing heart attacks. Here are some thoughts on how to reduce cholesterol naturally;

Eat heart-healthy foods

reduce cholesterol and improve your heart health:

Reduce saturated fats. Saturated fats, found primarily in red meat and full-fat dairy products, raise your total cholesterol. Decreasing your consumption of saturated fats can reduce your low-density lipoprotein (LDL) cholesterol — the "bad" cholesterol.

Eliminate trans fats. Trans fats, sometimes listed on food labels as "partially hydrogenated vegetable oil," are often used in margarines and store-bought cookies, crackers and cakes. Trans fats raise overall cholesterol levels. The Food and Drug Administration has banned the use of partially hydrogenated vegetable oils by Jan. 1, 2021.

Eat foods rich in omega-3 fatty acids. Omega-3 fatty acids don't affect LDL cholesterol. But they have other heart-healthy benefits, including reducing blood pressure. Foods with omega-3 fatty acids include salmon, mackerel, herring, walnuts and flaxseeds.

Increase soluble fibre. Soluble fibre can reduce the absorption of cholesterol into your bloodstream. Soluble fibre is found in such foods as oatmeal, kidney beans, Brussels sprouts, apples and pears.

Add whey protein. Whey protein, which is found in dairy products, may account for many of the health benefits attributed to dairy. Studies have shown that whey protein given as a supplement lowers both LDL cholesterol and total cholesterol as well as blood pressure.

Eat fruit and vegetables. Eating 900grams of vegetables and or fruit was shown in a large trial, to reduce the risk of heart attack by over 20% relative to a matched group who did not eat fruit or vegetables. That is an effect equivalent to statins! Lose weight. Carrying even a few extra pounds contributes to high cholesterol. Small changes add up.. Weight reduction has been shown to reverse diabetes in some case of type 2 diabetes, the form related to weight gain, and it markedly reduces the need for diabetes medication in most diabetics.

Look for ways to incorporate more activity into your daily routine, such as using the stairs instead of taking the lift or parking farther from your office. Take walks during breaks at work.

So, if we add together these benefits, we get an accumulation of marginal and not so marginal gains, leading to a significant improvement in health and longevity.

## 'So they do say...!'

rom the architects inspection of St Mary's Church in 1878:
"I cannot find any trace of the original upper stage of the Tower which has been rebuilt of brick of the commonest type".

He goes on to comment that the curious wrought iron structure built in to the North West angle has a base which might have been let into the centre part of a spire, and covered in shingle, "a usual finish to towers of this date".

The suggestion he made is that the tower formerly had a spire, probably a short one, of wood, which was later removed.



## Terry's Chocolate Cheesecake

(Serves 10-12)

#### **Biscuit Base:**

300g chocolate orange digestive biscuits

140g unsalted butter, melted and cooled slightly

#### **Cheesecake Filling:**

500g full-fat cream cheese, softened at room temperature
2 x 175g Terry's chocolate orange
300ml double cream
85g icing sugar, sifted
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

#### **Decoration:**

Terry's chocolate orange segments **Method:** 

To prepare the base: Melt the butter in a small saucepan. Blitz the biscuits in a food processor to a fine crumb. Add the melted butter and mix until well combined. Tip the biscuit crumbs into a 23cm springform cake tin and press down until firm. Use the back of a spoon of glass to smooth over, place in the refrigerator to chill whilst you make the filling.

To make the cheesecake filling: Melt the chocolate over a bain-marie. Leave to cool only for a few minutes - chocolate stills needs to be slightly warm before adding the remaining cheesecake ingredients later to avoid lumps forming.

In a medium mixing bowl beat together the cream cheese with the icing sugar and vanilla until softened. In another mixing bowl whisk the cream until soft peaks form. Fold the cream into the cream cheese mix. Finally, fold through the

melted chocolate.

Spoon the cheesecake mixture over the biscuit base and smooth over with a spatula or palette knife. Cover and leave to chill for at least 6 hours,

or preferably overnight.

When ready to serve, remove the cheesecake from the tin and decorate. Best serve chilled.

The cheesecake can be made ahead of time, leave it in the tin, covered with cling film for up to 2 days.

Leftover slices (if any!) can be stored in an airtight container in a refrigerator.

## Farming Notebook

## Potato harvest begins

e have just managed a few days away in St Ives. Lovely beaches, long walks, and some refreshing swims in the sparkling sea. As one of our number quite aptly put it, for us it was an oasis between harvests. Very true.

The combine has, at last, been put away for another season.
There was a time in July when we thought all would have been safely gathered in by mid August, but it was not to be. The spring oats and spring beans were delayed by the very welcome rain and both crops needed drying!! We also helped out a neighbour with some combining as he was trying to beat the weather, and between us we almost succeeded.

The potato harvest has just begun. A couple of weeks later than usual because the crop was so slow to develop during the heat and drought. Once the rain arrived they got a new lease of life, literally, and grew like stink.

The rain has caused an unex-

pected problem in the potatoes. Secondary tuberisation. The daughter tubers have been fooled by the heat into thinking they have reached the end of their growth and gone into premature dormancy. The rains have woken them up and they have started to produce long thin shoots at the end of which is a newly forming tuber. The only way to control this is to lift the crops as quickly as possible and get them into cold store.

To this end we have tried to kill off the plants with a combination of flailing off the canopy above ground followed by the application of a desiccant. Usually this is very successful, but this year new shoots begin to appear after a few days. The vigour of the plants is astonishing. They are making up for lost time, and causing us a real headache. We cannot lift the crop until the skins are "set" and this only happens once the foliage is dead.

For the first time ever we are putting the whole crop into store and not grading for size. The speeds up the grading process and will allow us to clear the fields more quickly. Once the tubers have been cooled we will have to re-grade the whole lot to split the seed from the oversize. Potatoes in general, and seed in particular are in very short supply this year, and as a result we may be able to sell seed that is outside the

usual parameters of 35-55mm diameter. So the delay caused by cooling the crop may be helpful as we will better know the market once we start to re-grade.

Our Oilseed Rape has been planted and now has true leaves, which is a relief. It is such a vulnerable crop until well established. After such a hot and dry summer it would have been assumed that slugs would not feature as a major pest this year. A very dangerous assumption! The little blighters are there and in numbers. Liking nothing better than a meal of newly emerged rape. The cabbage stem flea beetles are also having a go at the new seedlings. We are no longer allowed to treat the seed to protect against the pest so it is becoming a real problem as other control methods are far less effective.

The cattle are enjoying the late flush of grass. All the cows and their calves look very well. Cattle seem to do well in hot dry summers... The herd are all close to home as we are preparing for our compulsory TB (Tuberculosis) test. We are in an area of low risk and have a four year interval between tests. It is a nervous time. Any animal that reacts to the test has to be slaughtered, even

if it is heavily in calf. We have so many badgers on the farm, and deer are not far away. Both species can transmit TB and aid in its spread across the country. We are a closed herd, and buy no cattle in. This means that TB can only be introduced by a third party vector. Why is it OK to slaughter a cow but not a badger?

Having had a reactor in the past, which was proved in post mortem not to have TB (A bit late for the cow and unborn calf in question!) it really is a time to keep fingers firmly crossed...

On a brighter note, it is nearly time for the annual ploughing match. A great day out for the farming community. Fierce competition to see who can turn the best furrow, bake the best cake, or show the best sample of wheat and a chance to catch up with friends and colleagues whilst enjoying the hospitality of our suppliers. A good day out.
