

A Summary of the Annual General Meeting of Elmsted Parish Council held on Tuesday, 7th May 2013

The pot holes in Whatsole Street need work, as does the Misling Lane/Maxted Street area.

The dog waste situation in Bodsham has improved but will continue to be monitored.

Cllr Argar was duly elected as Chairman and Cllr Francesconi was duly elected as Vice-Chairman.

It was agreed that there should be a third signatory for cheques, Cllr Burge agreed that he would do this.

Financial Statement was approved.

Cheques were signed for CPRE, KALC, Aon Ltd (Insurance), District Audit, Evington Hall and T Block for the Clerks Remuneration from 2012.

The Annual Accounts and the Accounting Governance Statement were approved and signed by the Chair of the Parish Council and are ready for the Internal Audit inspection.

Cllr Monk reported that there will be a new leader in the financial year. There will be no increase in Council Tax this financial year as the Government have funded a zero increase. Should funding be withdrawn next year, there is likely to be a 2% increase. The Community Chest is now available for funding applications; it is available to precepted parishes in addition to others now.

The members of the public expressed their disappointment in the result of the wind turbine application at Beech Tree. David Monk explained that Shepway Councillors do not want to see the wind turbines in an AONB but the planning law states that they should be allowed. The Development Control Committee are getting better at finding reasons to refuse them, there was some discussion about the contentious turbine. The question of whether a referendum would have been useful was discussed. A referendum would have cost the Parish up to £3,000 and it is only advisory not mandatory, therefore, the Planning Inspectorate could have over-ruled the referendum. Cllr Monk continues to work towards a policy for no wind turbines to be allowed in an AONB. His only advice was to write to the MP as

to urge Prime Legislation to apply to these cases. It was suggested that the Planning Officer at Shepway was aware that this wind turbine is non-compliant and is in clear breach of the Government Guidelines. Have lessons been learned from this process? The residents in the area are looking at High Court costs of £25–30,000 to over-turn this decision. Cllr Monk was thanked for attending the meeting.

Road problems were mentioned and it was suggested that if repairs are not completed, the reference number needs to be forwarded to Susan Carey.

The next meeting was confirmed as Tuesday, 3rd September 2013.

A SUMMARY OF THE MEETING OF HASTINGLEIGH PARISH COUNCIL ON 11th JUNE 2013

The Parish Council is aware of the new planning legislation but note that the new legislation does not apply in this Parish as we are situated in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The Parish Council welcomed Charlotte Brooks-Lawrie to the meeting. Charlotte introduced the Local Plan and explained the core Strategy. This is a consultation process that is tailor made to each parish. The entire plan will be completed by 2014/15.

Hastingleigh Parish Council discussed the options available to them and decided that they would deliver a questionnaire to each property in the Parish and collate answers for completion at the September meeting.

A copy of the financial report was distributed to all Councillors.

There were no cheques to be signed.

Cllr Johnson queried whether the Councillors details were available on the website and the Clerk confirmed that they are.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday July 9th 2013.

NHS Non-Emergency and Emergency Services — Are they working?

There has been a great deal of publicity recently concerning both the NHS non-emergency and emergency (A and E departments) services. The new non-emergency service (NHS111) started in April of this year and is now in operation in most parts of the country. But there have been serious teething problems in almost all areas. NHS111 replaced NHS Direct and local 'out of hours services' which were finally discontinued in June 2013. It is available 24 hours a day, and every day of the year and is for urgent but none life threatening issues. It complements the long established emergency 999 number which is used only for real emergencies, although the 111 service does also use the ambulance service when necessary. Unlike the 999 service, the 111 service offers access to various health services and should be used when:-

You need medical help quickly but it is not a 999 emergency

You think you may need to go to A and E or some other NHS urgent care service

You don't know who to call

You need health information or reassurance about what to do next.

When you telephone 111 your call should be answered promptly and you will be asked a series of questions (standard) to determine what is appropriate for you. The telephones are staffed by teams of advisers (not clinical) who are supported by nurses and paramedics.

One of the initial problems with the 111 system has been the long waiting times for the initial phone call to be answered. Coincidentally there has also been an increase in the numbers of people attending A and E.

The Wye Patient Participation Group is anxious to determine how well these systems are working for you. If you have used the 111 system or have been to A and E recently please will you contact the Group before the end of September and give the details of your experience. Important points to report are:-

How long did you wait for the telephone to be answered?

Was the advice given to you clear?

Were you satisfied with the outcome?

A and E

Which hospital did you attend?

How long did you wait to be seen?

INCENSED OF WYE SURGERY

I thought this month I would explain how to access health care. It has become clear from recent pronouncements that our political leaders either do not understand the system or are out to deliberately mislead . I can only assume this is a political smoke screen to redirect flack from the appalling 111 system that they introduced.

When I was a houseman over twenty years ago, admissions through casualty were rising at about ten percent per year for reasons which were not clear. GPs were doing their own on call at the time. They have continued this inexorable rise. You will have read recently that the rise in AE attendance is due to GPs opting out of on call. This is propaganda. In fact the only recent change in process is, yes, you guessed it 111.

Triage was invented by Napoleon's surgeon, Baron, Dominique Jean Larrey and the principle has always been that the most highly qualified and skilled person should make the initial assessment. The profession told the government that the 111 system was flawed because it flouts this principle. Why are we not surprised to find that the failings are deflected onto others, plus ca change, plus c'est la meme chose! In fact on that note, a friend working for the department of transport as an adviser told me how staggered he was at how little the department understood the railway system. It doesn't surprise me, they know little about the way general practice works and have no interest it seems in finding out.

I was doing an on call session two days after 111 was introduced (you can't have done Allan , Mr Hunt and the Mail tell us GPs are not doing out of hours work, quite who they think is doing the 24/7 cover I am not sure as only qualified GPs can practice general practice!). I was expecting a deluge of work. In the move to 111, SouthEast Health, the local out of hours provider, lost its integrated telephone triage system whereby calls were directed to a doctor or nurse to determine whether a visit or surgery assessment was required. Instead, with 111, non medical people would use lengthy protocols before telling you to ring 999! Or passing requests for a visit or consultation on to SEH.

I hope you are following, I agree it's complex. Anyway back to my on call session, instead of the deluge I saw ten percent of the work expected. Why you ask?

Because the organisation running 111 had decided the numbers needed to man the phones were far fewer than SEH used. People failed to get through and......went to AE. Is a picture emerging here somewhat different to government propaganda, ably supported by the good people of the Mail. That propaganda would be better spent informing people that GPs do actually work 24 hours a day and that they

So for the benefit of Mr Hunt, the surgery is open from 8.30 until 7.00pm Monday to Thursday and you can also access the dispensary during these hours. Nurses work until 7pm too. On Friday the last appointment is 5pm and the dispensary closes at 530. A doctor is available until 6.30 on Fridays. Doctors do not only work during these hours, they have numerous administrative tasks that have to be done after surgery. I know doctors who finish at 9 or 10 o'clock in the evening.

Outside of these times you dial 111. I believe they are getting their act together under massive government pressure and 70% of calls are now answered in 60 seconds. They will advise or direct you to a consultation centre such as a surgery or in some cases arrange a visit BY A GP ON CALL Mr Hunt.

Only use AE for accidents or emergencies as for anything else you will see a very junior doctor in all likelihood and wait four hours for the pleasure. He or she will then suggest you see your GP.

We have refined the morning super surgery, we will still aim to see all comers in the morning, you can request a female doctor if there is one in surgery. If you think only a particular doctor can manage your problem you can now request a call-back from a particular doctor (if he is in surgery) who will deal with the problem or arrange to see you.

Finally why not ask your MP to discontinue the war on general practice, every GP I know works enormously long hours under fierce pressure of both time and dwindling resources. Their will to do what is best for their patients often against an unwilling system is heart warming. The quality of applicants is though, falling as the milk and honey stories the Mail adore (what is it with those people?) are found to be a nonsense. You may remember the much chastised New GP contract, in fact this was introduced because jobs in general practice just couldn't be filled and they needed to make it more attractive, they need to do the same now, and quickly. What they do not need to do, is reduce resources, pass more work from hospitals to general practice and then feed disinformation about the problems all being caused by lazy GPs.

I really do enjoy my job in spite of that, however I despise dishonesty for political ends. It stinks Mr Hunt, it stinks. Rant over.

FROM WYE BENEFICE

A couple of months ago I was asked to write an article for the magazines around the benefice...a kind of goodbye. As you do I have thought about it on and off uncertain what to say. As I write now I am conscious that many of us have our hearts full of another goodbye as we mourn the loss of Rev Dickie Cleveland an inspirational friend and colleague.

Goodbyes are hard for us wonderful and funny little creatures as we try valiantly to sidestep change and define the unknown, and vicars are no exception to this. It has been just a touch tricky to have those conversations about "what next" and to explain that I don't know where I will be living or when or what I might do next when it comes to the church. Perhaps you too have found yourself cast in the role of reluctant adventurer knowing that the time had come for change.

Over these months up the hills there has been a cry echoing around our churches. "We must have faith" they have said as they contemplate their future. I cannot say begin to say how wonderful it is to be a part of such courageous people.

Like the rest of us I have been tempted to focus on what disturbs the peace, and disrupts the smooth flow of my life, and in so doing I can miss a thing, for in every ending there is always a beginning. For me an opportunity to develop my practice as an artist and an art psychotherapist. For you a new House for duty priest in the hill villages, and the even bigger endings also have new life and new beginnings wrapped in their folds.

For me some things will stay the same I will continue to earn my living as a psychotherapist and clinical supervisor, travelling up to the west end each week and starting a practice in Canterbury in the coming months. I will resume the mission work in the Lebanon which has been put on hold. and I will continue to serve the church as a trainer, facilitator, and priest.

All that remains to be said is a simple and heart felt thank you for your company and encouragement on this last stage of my personal journey and an open invitation to walk together in friendship on the next.




