My dear friends

"We hope and pray - indeed we insist - that we have seen the last of violence. We demand the right to solve our own problems by dialogue and the noble pursuit of consensus." These are the words of Mary McAleese, the eighth Irish President. They were tucked away on page nine of a national newspaper.

Tragically, the longer an evil persists, the more we become accustomed to its presence and learn to live and accept as normal what may be profoundly destructive. The violent and brutal murders and calculated destruction of property is an evil. Sadly we become so accustomed that the prayers and determination of an Irish president only make a page nine. In some papers it may not have been reported at all.

Christmas is God's reminder that there can be no accommodation with evil, but that this way is not one of repression, punishment and violence but through a new relationship and a continuing dialogue to establish justice and peace in which God through His Spirit plays a part.


The Christmas story has all the evils that should be addressed. The census reminds of the repression many experience in many nations. The poverty of the stable jerks our conscience to the plight of the homeless and the refugee, the slaughter of children by Herod, to the cruelty and inhumanity of leaders in pursuit of power. In a baby born in a little known village about 2000 years ago is God's word to us. It speaks of reconciliation, of forgiveness and of peace and the cost was borne on a cross.

Can we continue to pray for those who share the cost but seek reconciliation and peace.

May I wish you and your families a blessed Christmas.




SEASON'S REETINGS

PLEASE CAN YOU HELP?

One of my hobbies is collecting postcards, in particular ones depicting our local villages (Elmsted, Hastingleigh, Waltham and Petham). As you can imagine they are few and far between. I enjoy spending time sorting through boxes of cards in junk shops, fairs etc.

I even found one in the local market while visiting my brother in Lincolnshire. It is of 'The cricket ground and park Evington Place, Elmsted' and was posted in Wye in 1914 to somewhere in Kent, but most of the writing which was in pencil has faded.

One postcard or photograph I would particularly like to find is of the old school at Waltham which used to be on Church Hill next to the churchyard.

I collect both old and modern, used and unused cards.

Please don't cry for me, mum, when I needed you, you were always there.


I have one last question, mum, before I say goodbye.

HYMN WRITER OF THE MONTH

The intention of this article and following ones throughout the year is to present a monthly pen portrait of a hymn writer whose birthday occurred within the current month. Unless stated otherwise hymn numbers refer to the hymn book used by our Benefice which is Hymns Ancient and Modern New Standard. This month the hymn writer is:

John Mason Neale b. London 24 January 1818 d. 1866

Hymn 208 O happy

O happy band of pilgrims if onward ye would tread With Jesus as your fellow to Jesus as your head

In a busy, relatively short and far from easy life, John Mason Neale is remembered for two outstanding achievements. The first can be seen at East Grinstead in Sussex - the Convent of the Sisterhood of St. Margaret, an Order he founded at Rotherfield, then eventually moving to its present location. The second achievement is the immense contribution he made to English hymnody. His total output of hymns was around 400. A few were original compositions, although only a handful are in common use today. The main bulk of Neale's genius is revealed in his translations of early Latin and Greek hymns. It is a selection of these that predominate in Neale's contribution to our hymn books. Such was his skill as translator, that, when it came to the Latin hymns, he retained the original metre in order for the English words to be sung to the ancient plainsong.

How about the man behind these achievements? His father was the Rev. Cornelius Neale. He died when John was only five years old. The son, however, showing the same intellectual prowess as his father, went to Cambridge and after graduation was elected a Fellow and Tutor at Downing College. On eleven consecutive occasions he won one of the University's coveted prizes in poetry. It was during his time at Cambridge that he became interested in the Catholic movement within the Church of England, known as the Oxford Movement. With an undergraduate, Benjamin Webb, Neale founded the 'Cambridge Camden Society' which, through its publication of 'The Ecclesiologist', promoted the High Church, or Ritualist Movement associated with the second stage of the Oxford Movement whose apostle was E.B Pusey.

Neale's life seems to have become problematical when he left the safe confines of his Cambridge college. He became incumbent of Crawley, Sussex, in 1843, having married and, as was the rule in those days, relinquishing his Fellowship. He was not long at Crawley; ill health forced him to resign and he had a long convalescence until, in 1846. Lord Delaware presented him to the Wardenship of Sackville College, East Grinstead. The old buildings still remain in the High Street. Here Neale stayed until the end of his life. It was here that he produced much of his amazing literary work. But another problem was confronted, this time in the person of the Bishop of Chichester. It was still a risky business to tamper with the Church's worship for the purposes of introducing Catholic ritual. Neale's active support of ritualism had become bothersome to the bishop and he issued a prohibition on Neale which lasted fourteen years. Nonetheless, with other leading lights of the Catholic Revival, Neale was able to spearhead the movement nationally. At Sackville College he used much of his time concentrating his efforts on the small group of sisters at Rotherfield, ably supported by the Rector's daughter ministering to the sick and needy. After removal to East Grinstead in 1856, and prior to the building of the Convent, the work progressed with the founding of an orphanage, a school for girls and a House for fallen women at Aldershot. Even so, things were not easy. There were always mobs, vehemently against the ritualists, that made the work far from easy. On one occasion a mob attacked a funeral of one of the sisters taking place at Lewes.

The hymn, 'O happy band of pilgrims', although one of his original compositions, was heavily influenced by an ancient Greek hymn by one Joseph the Hymnographer, a ninth century monk who founded a monastery in Constantinople. The hymn is included in Neale's 'Hymns of the Eastern Church' published in 1862. The words are not usually associated with New Year. But if life is conceived as a pilgrimage, another year is a measurement of that journey. The hymn gives plenty of encouragement. There are references to suffering and deprivation as well. Throughout his life Neale was no stranger to these. Neither at times are we.

Hymns A&M New Standard contains around thirty of Neale's translations. Some are still regularly sung; 'All glory, laud and honour' (60), 'The day of resurrection!'(75), 'A great and mighty wonder' (43). 'The royal banners forward go' (58) has the option of the plainsong setting. The others can be traced through the index of authors in the full music edition of A & M.
