FOOTPATH WALK - 8th NOVEMBER

Our band of twelve [9 women & 3 men!] started in Wye and passed through the churchyard then took the path by the allotments and afterwards crossed the Olantigh Rd.

We took the track towards the Downs eventually taking a left turn passing a rough field that had just been stocked with sheep. On reaching the road to Little Olantigh walked up it until reaching a footpath to the left, passed through a wood and then came out on a magnificent panoramic view and the site of the Old Race course. Much discussion ensued on when it was last used and the consensus was mid - late 19th century, after which it moved to the fields near the station finally closing in 1974.

Returning along the path, this time we crossed the road and made our way passed the O2 mast array and on towards Cold Harbour Lane, passing one of the many disused college sites.

Briefly going along Amage road we then turned right towards Silks Farm and then right along the track behind Withersdane Hall. We were reminded that this time last year we visited St Eustace's Well, which we could see in the distance.

We then returned to the village via Scotton Street and Jean very kindly invited us back for a cup of tea and cake.

A very pleasant afternoon, amazingly in the dry! - Thank you Jean.

Race course Post script from Wikipedia

"The first racing in Wye took place on 29 May 1849 at the Crown. Originally, racing took place over fences and on the flat, but in 1878 the course moved to Harville Farm adjacent to the station and flat racing ceased. Steeplechases, however, continued to be held in September, January, March, and May until 1974. Wye station had a special designated platform for the race course"







May next year bring many blessings upon us all and may we grow to know each other better as the time goes by.

EVINGTON GARDENERS

"The return to nature as a retreat from Victorian sophistication was initiated by the middle classes and expressed itself in the search for the English rural scene..."(Geoffrey Jellicoe) The essence of the Arts and Crafts movements and its gardens and how it tried to return to the English rural scene of medieval times was the subject of Stephen Harmer's excellent talk at the meeting in October. He explained how the Victorians, after the natural landscaping of William Kent and Capability Brown in the 18th century, started to put formality back into the garden with the emphasis on elaborate bedding displays consisting of plants raised in the new greenhouses of the day. The Arts and Crafts movement, led by John Ruskin and William Morris, was a reaction against Victorian mass production and formality, and looked back to the literature and architecture of the medieval period and the Italian renaissance as well as to the natural world. These ideas were reflected in the garden of the writer and gardener, William Robinson, at Gravetye Manor, and in those designed by his disciple. Gertrude Jekyll. At the Gavetye, a medieval manor house, the bones of the garden were still laid out mathematically but very much softened with planting. Wild flower meadows were included. Plants were to blend and work together, be packed into the borders and remain in the ground all year. Other ingredients in Arts and Crafts gardens were terracing and different levels, garden 'rooms' with strong hedges, a sports lawn (evoking Francis Drake's game of bowls as the Spanish Armada approached in the English Channel), the use of local materials to harmonise with the locality, old fashioned flowers and vegetables, a nuttery and old fruit trees, loggias and formal pools (echoes of the Italian renaissance), pergolas (evoking the medieval arbour), sculpture and terracotta pots and urns together with a general freedom of growth and profusion.

The development of the Arts and Crafts style in gardening was made possible by the fall in land prices at the end of the 19th century. In the ensuing sales by large landowners land was bought by the professional classes for the creation of their gardens. As well as Gravetye Manor, the audience also saw pictures of the Salutation Garden in Sandwich, Upton Grey, Munstead Wood (Jekyll's own

garden), Great Dixter, Hidcote Manor and Long Barn near Sevenoaks. Mr Harmer's talk was most enlightening and was very much enjoyed by members.

By the time this appears, members will also have enjoyed a talk about Old Ashford given by Richard Filmer in November.

Pat Homer has retired from supervising the raffle. We are all immensely grateful to Pat for her help and support over the years, and we continue to look forward to seeing her at meetings as we do to anyone who would like to come and join us. J.P.

After picking up our overland truck from the Port at Walvis Bay, Namibia, we spent about four days on a campsite at nearby Swakopmund, regrouping and sorting the living accommodation out. It was fantastic to be back in our familiar surroundings, where we could cook for ourselves, and sleep in our

own bed. Hotels are seriously over rated!

We left Swakopmund with Ze Germans and an English couple, Phil and Angie, that we met there (having shipped their 4x4 camper direct from UK to Namibia), with the plan to drive up the Swakop river bed, bush camp overnight then exit the river bed further 'up stream'. When we got to our entry point, the deep sand took us all by surprise, and as it was in the heat of the mid day sun, the sand was very "mobile". Colonel K (our overland truck) very quickly showed his weight and got well and truly stuck! All six of us spent about an hour getting it out using sand ladders, and back to slightly firmer sand. While we were re inflating our tires, Phil got his Iveco camper stuck, and so we then had to extract him out of the river bed, this all took a fair amount of time and it seemed that we were being watched by a local farmer that appeared in his pick up truck, he thought we were completely bonkers trying to enter the river bed here. Anyway in the end no harm was done and we ended up camping in a fantastic secluded spot in the Namib Desert.

The next morning we decided to head off on our own (always our plan), and said our goodbyes (we had been with Andreas and Mareika for about 6 weeks), and headed North into the Erongo District, and to the Spitzkoppe Mountain range. This range is formed from huge granite boulders, that rise up to nearly 1600m from the arid desert floor, it is a fantastic magical place, and although we stayed at the campsite there, you would never know it was a specific site, as each site is so far from the next (200-300 metres apart), and we ended up staying here for 4 nights .

Next stop was Damaraland, and Namibia's highest mountain, the Brandberg which stands at 2573m, this is also a popular place for spotting the famous Desert Adapted Elephants. When we got there we found a fantastic spot next to the dried up river bed, and noticed that the place was covered in fresh elephant foot prints, and some dung, we had just missed them, a herd had been through about an hour previously! arrrrrr! We stayed two nights here, but this time we were unlucky (we had seen them on our previous trip to Namibia, near here), but it really is a lovely spot. We then moved further North into Damaraland, first staying near Twyfelfontein, and then just outside the very small town of Kamanjab.

Until just under a year ago almost 50% of Etosha National Park was out of bounds to virtually all visitors (all of the West side), and then they decided to open a new campsite in the middle of this area, and so opening up all of this area to self drive campers. So our plan was to enter Etosha at the far west

Galton Gate, then drive through the park to Olifantrus Campsite, and spend a couple of nights here. Wow, what a treat, the water hole here has had a hide built right over the water and you can watch the animals here all day and night (they have red lights on over the waterhole). From here we watched at close range, elephants, rhino, gemsbok, kudu, springbok, warthogs, zebra, and many more animals. Plus the drive around the parks tracks also showed us lions first hand. Etosha NP really is the perfect place to view wildlife in their natural surroundings. We then drove all the way through to the East side of the park, staying at the campsite at Halali on the way (more details on our blog www.lorrywaydown.com). Etosha NP is huge, it is well over 300km from gate to gate if you take the route that we did, and with the West now opened up (but still very quiet), it really is an amazing experience.

After leaving the National Park we stayed just outside the old mining town of Tsumeb for a few days, before again driving North through Ovamboland and towards the Angola border, and Ruacana Falls. There is very rarely any water coming over the falls now as the water is regulated by the Hydro Electric plant and the dam (this power plant provides over 50% of Namibia's power), but the River Kunene here is stunning! We stayed at a campsite right on the

river bank, this is a community site, and is run by the local Himba people. These people have seen their lives turned upside down over the last 30 years (since the Angola war), and though they still carry on their traditional way of life to some extent (dress, and customs especially), it is inevitable that their way of life is changing forever. They are still one of the least influenced peoples in Africa. The Dam at Ruacana Falls was bombed in 1988 by a Cuban airstrike (yes, a Cuban airstrike), and just goes to show how messed up this area of the world was, but should now show what can be done if peace is given a chance. We loved the basic camp area of Ruacana, and the friendliness of the local Himba, including the kids.

Our next stop, after a brief stay in the rough and ready town of Opuwo (where we refuelled and restocked the larder), was Kaokoland, and Epupa Falls in the far North of Namibia, and again on the River Kunene. These falls definitely did have water flowing over them, despite it being the dry season here at the moment, the water comes from Angola, and with us camped right at the top of the falls, the sight and sound was incredible. The temperature up next to the border was well over 40c in the shade and only dropped to about 28c at night, so it was very hot, and it was tempting to have a quick dip in the river. Until we spotted the crocodiles swimming about or lazing about in the sun, so not a good idea! We spent a few days up there, and one morning we had a Himba guide to take us along the river, we spent 3.5 hours in this splendid landscape and learnt quite a lot, not only about the natural flora and fauna, but also about the local Himba way of life.

After another overnight stop in Opuwo, and an aborted trip South via Sesfontain (due to the road being closed for blasting), we headed down the

The next day we drove down through the Skeleton Coast National Park, which has to be undertaken in daylight, as they do not allow any overnight camping in the national park, a permit has to be obtained and you hand it back in on exit from the park. It is a truly wild and in places barren landscape, but as with all places in Namibia, it has its own beauty. As I type this we are camped on the beach just outside the Skeleton Coast, and in the (newly formed) Dorob National Park.

Our plan is to return to Swakopmund for a few days as we need to get a few bits done on Colonel K, including repairs after hitting a cow on route!

NHS under pressure!

So what's new? The NHS has always been under pressure, but just recently we have become more and more aware of the stresses and strains within the system. These are apparent in general practice, the hospital trust, in mental health and in social care. One of the main problems faced by all sectors is the recruitment of suitable staff without whom the system cannot work. The use of agency staff as stop gaps just aggravates the problems and adds to costs.

The hospital trust will be having public consultation meetings early in the new year to get your views on proposed major changes in services. Please support these if you can.

Locally, the new appointment system at our surgery is an attempt to do more with less. Personal contact with your doctor is very important as it generates confidence as you get to know each other. This can only be partially achieved on the telephone. Each doctor has a limited number of appointments each day. If it is decided that you need to see a doctor, there are only a small number of appointments available each day and if these are all filled, you may be offered an appointment for a subsequent day or perhaps with another doctor.

Also, should you have transport problems, it is advisable to make preparations before you telephone otherwise you may not be able to respond to the request to come to the surgery quickly.

All patients have to help to make the system successful, remembering that the Practice staff cannot work miracles and are often limited by procedures prescribed by NHS England.

To help us all get the best from the new system, the PPG suggests the following:-

- telephone early if you want to speak to or perhaps see the doctor of your choice.
- inform the doctor about your limitations in terms of transport so that these can be taken into account
- think carefully about what you will say and ensure that clear descriptions of symptoms are given (help is available on the web- search 'describing my symptoms').
- · know what medication you are on including dose .

Do not hesitate to ask friends or relatives to help with the collation of your information if you think you may need it. Accurate information will enable your diagnosis and treatment.

On the 23rd January Vivaldi's *Gloria* and Haydn's *Nelson Mass* plus Mozart's *Eine Kleine Nachtmusik*. On the 12th March there will be a performance of Handel Messiah and on the 18th June Verdi's Requiem.

On the 12th December at 7.00pm the Choral Society plus the Choral Society Youth choir will fill the Cathedral with Carols old and new and give the audience and the younger members especially the chance to sing. This wonderful work lay undiscovered until the late 1920's when it was found buried among a pile of forgotten Vivaldi manuscripts. Haydn's *Nelson Mass* is arguably his greatest single composition – he wrote the work as his reputation was at its peak in 1798 but the world was in turmoil with Napoleon having won four major battles with Austria in less than a year. The mass was named Missa in Augustiis but on its first performance Napleon had been defeated by British forces led by Admiral Horatio Nelson and hence the work was nicknamed Lord Nelson Mass. Soloists for the evening will be Zoë Brown, Esther Brazil, William Morgan and David Shipley.






