

Minutes from last month's meeting

ASTINGLEIGH with Elmsted W.I. met on Thursday,7th September at the Evington Hall. Fifteen members attended, and we also welcomed a guest.

Our speaker this month was Heather Woodward, who spoke about Ightham Mote. She gave us a fascinating talk about the house. Built around 1238, it has been in the care of the National Trust since 1985. She told us about its' renovation and restoration. We were shown photos of how the rooms had changed over the years, and also a picture of a garderobe – an ancient privy for the servants - that involved a piece of wood over the moat! The staffing of the house declined dramatically after the Second World War, going from 27 at the end of

the 19th century, to 7 staff, still doing the same jobs. The house finally got electricity in 1955.

The house has been described as one of the loveliest manor houses in the world, and is also home to a Grade One listed kennel.

After our speaker had finished and we'd had our cup of tea, we discussed various items of business.
The flower of the month was won by Mrs. Helmer.
Our next meeting will be on Thursday, 5th October at 7.30 p.m. in the Evington Hall, where we will be having a cake -icing workshop. Any new members would be made most welcome!



Occasional memories from our past

12 Apr 1836 Kentish Gazette

n 7th April an inquisition was held before Mr. T.T.
Delasaux, in the parish of Hastingleigh, on the body of **Thomas Marshall** aged three and a half.

It appeared that the poor child had gone into a field belonging to his father, in which was depasturing a ram, which immediately run at, and struck him on the hinder part of his head, forcing him against some pailings.

The child lingered about an hour, when death terminated its sufferings. The Jury returned a verdict of Accidental Death, and levied a deodand of 1 shilling on the ram.

A Deodand is a fine against an animal or object for being the cause of a death of a human and is paya-

ble to God by the owner.

About those church pews...

rurther to last month's article about the removal and whereabouts of the box pews in Elmsted's St James church c.1874, a reader knows what happened to them.

The Castle family lived at Dowles Farm from 1922. A member of that family interviewed older relatives and produced a history of their stay there. Here is an extract of that history.

"Leading off from the brick-paved area outside the back door of the [Dowles] farmhouse, was the wood lodge, a very old building.

The back wall was the brick wall of the garden. It had timbered walls and a thatched roof. It was very old and might have pre-dated the house.

Then we used to go down a slight slope into the sort of grassy area where there was a pond where the ducks used to be.

They were piles of wood that were sawn up for the house. A little further away was the granary, a two-storey building, which was still there in 1993.

Just adjacent to that was the old chicken house, this was quite an intriguing building because it had panelled walls and a thatched roof.

These panels came from the box pews that used to be in Elmsted Church. These panels must have been there for a long time because the building although tarred on the outside inside you could see the oak graining and the panels. It was a very interesting building." Recycling has always been a way of life. In Mary Harwood's well-known book Kentish Village: Hastingleigh of 1952 she says: "The sixteenth century Rectory on South Hill - old in years as well as in name - may yet tell some of its secrets. In the Ecclesiastical Surveyor's report on the buildings of the united [Hastingleigh and Elmsted] benefice in 1880, it mentions in regard to Elmsted: One acre of meadow land at the angle of the land from Hill Street to Spong Farm in the parish of Elmsted, on which formerly stood the Vicarage House of Elmsted, was pulled down about one hundred years ago, and the materials are said to have been used to enlarge the Rectory House at Hastingleigh."

'So they do

say...'

WHEN the longest-serving vicar, the Revd Gostwyck Prideaux, was in office, he made it known that he refused to pay the usual Churchyard fee for his burial at St Mary's. He insisted that he be buried just outside the churchyard boundary, thus avoiding this tax.

After he died in 1880, his parishioners thought hard about this and came up with a clever solution. They dug his grave just outside the Churchyard fence but added a short tunnel under the fence into the graveyard.

When his coffin was lowered into the grave outside the fence, as he had instructed, and the burial service performed, it was then slid into its final resting place just inside the fence where it rests today. The grave and memorial stone both to him and his wife, Lucretia, can be seen to the left of the gate on enter-

ing.



Wye Surgery news

ur phone triage system has bedded in now. It suits some patients well, others less so. There are lots of systems being trialled around the country to cope with the surge in demand for medical advice. Online systems offer the opportunity to leave details of your symptoms for a doctor to assess and either call you back or make you an appointment with a doctor or another health care provider. They also allow the option of dealing with administrative problems such as certificates and prescriptions.

In an ideal world we would expand the number of GPs but unfortunately, for many reasons, the government's plan for 5000 new GPs by 2020 has thus far achieved a fall in GP numbers. With a further fall in numbers forecast, as GPs retire and new GPs fail to materialise, alternative systems are needed. Physicians Associates are coming into the system, they are graduates who go on to train for two years

covering a range of medical areas. Paramedic practitioners are increasingly being used for urgent problems and home visits, under the guidance of GPs. Paramedic practitioners have at least 5 years of experience as paramedics and then a further two years of training in medicine. Nurse Practitioners and Advanced Nurse Practitioners have been used in many practices for years. They deal with a range of problems under the supervision of GPs.

Schemes are in place to try and bring GPs who have had maternity leave or have had a career break for other reasons, back into front line General Practice.

Attempts are being made to keep GPs at the end of their careers.

One of the primary issues is the cost of indemnity (the insurance a doctor must carry) Huge rises are expected this year. Providers are waiting for government guidance before implementing such rises. If the government fails to act and the rises are put in place, we may see a mass exodus of GPs who are currently doing odd sessions, whilst raising families or whilst winding down to retirement. Complaints can result in punitive indemnity charges sufficient to price a GP out of the market, I have heard of one GP, who got a minor slap on the wrist from the

£40000 for indemnity. He is leaving the country to work in Australia. This is the single biggest threat to General Practice in this country, watch for the outcome it will determine if General Practice has a future in the NHS.

Incidentally, it has been made clear to us, that we are not indemnified to offer treatment or advice for dental problems. We cannot therefore, provide antibiotics for dental infections, you will need to contact your dentist or **dentaline**. For emergency advice or help in finding your local Kent Dentaline service, please call 01634 890300.

Online resources related to health and well-being

There are a growing number of resources appearing on the internet aimed at supporting existing General Practice provision. 'Waitless' is an app that provides information about the waiting times at local A and E centres. As I check it now, on a Sunday evening, it tells me 17 patients are waiting at the Kent & Canterbury Hospital and 68 at the William Harvey Hospital where the waiting time is nearly four hours. The wait at Margate is an hour less.

www.healthhelpnow.nhs.uk is an NHS website. As I open it, it offers me three options: symptoms, services and advice. If I key in a symp-

tom and my postcode, it offers me advice articles, the suggestion that I contact my GP, and the 111 option. If I select 'Advice', it asks me the age-group of the patient and then offers simple advice.

www.nhs.uk/smokefree is, as it suggests, a stop-smoking site that provides advice and directs you to a stop-smoking counsellor for counselling and nicotine replacement or other medication.

http://www.nhs.uk/livewell offers advice on healthy living, couch to 5k, alcohol, smoking, weight loss and diet.

http://www.kent.gov.uk/social-care-and-health/health/release-the-pressure offers advice and a freephone number for those seeking advice and support with their mental health. It also provides the opportunity for a webchat for those that do not want to use a phone.

www.alzheimers.org.uk is a terrific resource for those who have Alzheimer's or are supporting someone with the disease. It offers resources and directs you to support in your local area. It offers an online community, advice on staying independent, financial advice and a helpline.

http://www.ageuk.org.uk offer an excellent site with information on benefits, staying healthy and how to get care and support.

www.diabetes.org.uk offers a comprehensive site providing 'the basics', prevention of diabetes and living with diabetes. Those with diabetes or pre-diabetes should look at this resource.

So many people google symptoms and diseases and find odd 'alternative' sites providing poorquality information. https:// patient.info provides a symptomchecker, health information, patient forums and more detailed information aimed at professionals, such as clinical guidelines. Three headings 'understanding depression', 'understanding hypertension' and 'understanding diabetes' are presented on the front page. A health A-Z gives high quality information on any different diseases. A search area invites me to enter my symptoms if I am feeling unwell.

https://web.ntw.nhs.uk/selfhelp/ is an excellent site, providing self-help leaflets on topics such as anxiety, bereavement, post-traumatic stress disorder, domestic violence and numerous other topics. http://www.moodjuice.scot.nhs.uk/ is a similar site in Scotland.

Vaccinations save lives!

The annual Flu clinic at Wye surgery was on Saturday 30th Sep-

tember, but of you were unable to come that day there are appointments available every day in October - please ask the Receptionist in the surgery.

Public Health England is calling for more take up of the Men-ACWY vaccine in eligible young people, which protects against deadly meningitis and septicaemia.

"Parents are being reminded this summer to encourage their 18 year old children to get vaccinated against deadly meningitis and septicaemia. Those who are due to leave school this summer, or aged 17 to 18 and are not in school (born between 1 September 1998) and 31 August 1999) are now eligible. The MenACWY jab protects against 4 strains of meningococcal disease which cause meningitis and septicaemia, known as strains A, C, W and Y. MenW is one of the most aggressive and life threatening forms and meningococcal disease can be fatal. Many survivors are left with life changing disabilities, including brain damage and loss of limbs. The MenACWY vaccine remains the best form of protection against the A, C, W, and Y strains with a 100% effectiveness rate in those that have been vaccinated so far. Young people are particularly at risk as they can be carriers of the disease. Being in confined envi-

Get vaccinated as soon as possible, remain vigilant and seek urgent medical help if you have concerns for yourself or friends. New entrants to higher education (university freshers) are also eligible. Anyone who is eligible and has missed vaccination in previous years remains eligible up to their 25th birthday and is urged to have the MenACWY vaccine. While the vaccine also helps protect against Men A, C, W and Y, it does not cover all forms of meningococcal disease. It is therefore important for parents and young people to be vigilant in spotting early symptoms and to seek early medical assistance if they are concerned".
