

#### **SPRING FAIR 2013**



#### NEWS FROM WYE SURGERY

The measles outbreak will I suspect become an epidemic. It serves as an interesting example of the complacency with which we treat once common diseases which have been suppressed by immunisation of the population.

Measles is one of the most transmissible diseases and is passed on from mucus droplets in saliva and nasal secretions. It is only suppressed in a population where 90% of the populace is immunised, an unusually high requirement, other diseases are much less easy to contract.

Because of Andrew Wakefields very poor publication that was picked up by the media, the number of children immunised fell sharply and we are now reaping the results.

Otherwise intelligent people are heard to claim 'well it didn't do me/my children (delete as appropriate) any harm'. My answer would be, how do you know. Many people develop permanent lung damage in the form of bronchiectasis which may manifest in later life. Others get more immediate complications, an otherwise fit 25 year old man died in the welsh outbreak and others are likely to die. Other complications include inflammation of the brain, pneumonia and a late complication occurs several years later in the form of a fatal brain disease SSPE. Otherwise it's just a really unpleasant illness for those lucky enough to get an uncomplicated form of the disease.

Diseases do not disappear, the only known exception is smallpox which was eradicated by immunisation worldwide. What they do is circulate in a community at low level without causing symptoms because of immunity and when the levels of immunity drop they reappear. There are outbreaks of polio, typhoid and diphtheria in the world where immunity is low.

There is an awful lot of ill-informed gibberish from plausible commentators with axes to grind on the Internet and a suggestion of complicity in an evil scheme by doctors aimed at injuring children with their evil vaccines. Others suggest homeopathy can immunise your children, a criminal untruth with no evidence base. HOMEOPATHY does NOT immunise! It may help in other ways but if your homeopath suggests they can immunise report them to their governing body.





#### VILLAGE TRIP TO FRANCE OR BELGIUM

- a) Gravelines, which is a small town located between Calais and Dunkerque just inland from the North Sea coast of France (about a 40 minute drive from Calais)

We would travel by coach from Evington Hall, departing around 7.30 am and returning around 8.30 pm. We would stop at a French supermarket on the return journey, as usual.

The cost would be approximately £20 per adult, children 16 and under travel free.

#### **HIGHLIGHTS from United Wye Benefice**

During the month of April, I spent quite a bit of time looking back over the last year (bearing in mind that church years, like tax years, run from April to April) and having done that, the following is a list of highlights (in chronological order). Obviously, lots of these happened in Wye church but equally, some, such as the confirmation service were very much benefice events...

18th May 2012: Jo Brand in conversation with the Reverend Richard Coles. What an evening that was! As Richard said afterwards, a fresh expression of church if ever there was one. And it raised nearly £5,000 for church funds. I was very grateful to Linda for arranging it in the first place, Karen Mitcalfe for project-managing it (superbly) and to Jo and Richard themselves for doing it free of charge. And we hope to put on similar events in the future. 3rd June: Jubilee service in Wye. A joyful day which we will never forget thanks to the great photo Richard Bartley took of us in our red, white and blue outfits. God save the Queen! 9th June: The wedding of supermodel Jacquetta Wheeler at Chilham Castle. Technically, this was nothing to do with the Wye benefice but it was still part of my ministry in the deanery. And I had my picture taken with Vivienne Westwood (which subsequently appeared in both the U.K. and the U.S. editions of Vogue, as I may have mentioned before...).

<u>27th October</u>: Wendy White-Thompson's 80th Birthday Party. A musical extravaganza master-minded by Mark Deller, Matthew King and Wendy herself. A real family celebration and just the sort of thing that should be happening in church, in my opinion. The only question is, why can't a woman be more like a man...?!

12th November: The launch of the Heal For Life Foundation in the U.K. This fantastic event took place at the London offices of Saatchi and Saatchi (thanks to Lucy and Francis Huntington's son, Richard, who is the Director of Strategy there). Over sixty people attended and we have since run our first 'healing week' for adult survivors of childhood abuse and trauma which was a great success and we will be running another in September. We are also planning an evening event for people in the benefice who would like to know more about the project but we are very grateful for the generous support we've had already (both prayerful and financial).

<u>29th November</u>: Confirmation service. Seven adults (one from Brook, two from Waltham and four from Wye) were confirmed by Bishop Trevor who said that adult confirmations are one of the best indicators that the church is alive and well and growing. Can we beat seven this year? If you or any of your family or friends would like to take your faith to the next level, I'd love to hear from you...

24th December: New, improved Crib service in Wye. Deputy Churchwarden, Alex Harris, and Warden, Ali Poole revamped the already-popular crib service to make it even better. Obviously, we still had Jane Gow's fantastic youth orchestra but the service was much shorter. At first, I was worried it was now too short but literally everyone I spoke to said it was just right so I'm delighted to have been wrong!

10th March 2013: Mothering Sunday service in Wye. As well as being a great service all round, Kevin Rall gave an incredibly-moving sermon honouring his mother, Clare, who had died literally a fortnight beforehand. I felt proud to be part of such an open and loving community and know that the sermon was hugely appreciated by all who heard it.

21st March: The enthronement of our new Archbishop. Like several of you, I was present in the cathedral for this historic event. I know there's already too many Old Etonians in positions of power (Prime Minister, Mayor of London, Vicar of Wye) but I think ++Justin will prove himself to be a worthy successor to ++Rowan and I'm looking forward to his first visit to Wye...

<u>30th March</u>: Holy Saturday in Elmsted. A great service with lots of (appropriate and cheerful) noise (bells, whistles, drums etc) followed by hot chocolate and fireworks. This should definitely become a tradition...

31st March: Easter Sunday in Wye. The biggest festival of the Christian year and another wonderful service. It was great to have both our fantastic choir and Jo Rall's worship band in the same service and someone who was worshipping in Wye for the first time told me afterwards that they'd never been to a service where the whole breadth of the Church of England was so visible with (pretty much) something for everyone. Again, I felt proud to be part of such an inclusive community and want to see this 'unity in diversity'

continue and develop. To paraphrase one of my favourite parts of the communion service, 'Though we are many [and have different tastes and styles] we are one body; because we all share in one bread'.

So, that's the highlights; but two very sad things happened this year as well. To deal with them in reverse order of both chronology and scale: in March, Madi informed me of her decision to stand down as House for Duty Priest in the Benefice. Clearly, she will be very hard to replace (in two senses). However, I am convinced that she has made the right decision for her and that God will provide. Meanwhile, she has done a fantastic job in the nearly three years that she has been in the role and I have learnt a huge amount from her. Please pray for her as she begins a new chapter in her life and ministry.

However, it's hard to see the positive side of our beloved Dickie's diagnosis of terminal cancer back in July - although, having said that, how fantastic that she has continued to bless us with her ministry for so long. And I know that the way she has responded to her illness has been a real inspiration to many people; including me. I also know that she and Pete feel hugely supported by all of you so please keep doing exactly what you have been doing and let's all be grateful for every day we have because all of us are, ultimately, in the same position: we only have this day; this moment; so, as a popular prayer puts it, may God grant us the wisdom and the grace to use aright the time that is left to us on earth - however long that may be.


#### Plan-It Ashford: Planning our Future together

Ashford Borough Council is embarking on the process of reviewing its adopted Core Strategy (which will now be known as Local Plan). The new plan will look forward to the year 2030 and will need to identify and address many diverse and complex challenges over this period.

However, unlike with previous Local Plans, this time we have no jobs or housing targets set out for us in advance. The council wants to work closely with parish councils to get a better understanding of any particular local issues that they feel will need to be addressed over the next 15 years. The role of the parish council is crucial in this and we want to build on any existing work undertaken previously (e.g. village design statement).

Taking the lead from an award-winning idea from Winchester, we have created a set of 'characters' to represent a cross section of a local community – all with different situations and issues that need to be addressed. The idea is that people can use these characters to communicate their own aspirations but also think about issues that might affect others in their community.

Hastingleigh Parish Council will be discussing this at their meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2013 at 7.45. Please come along and add your aspirations, this is your chance to make a difference to the future of your village....

#### CANTERBURY CATHEDRAL

BRITTEN Company of Heaven

VAUGHAM WILLIAMS Lark Ascending and An Oxford Elegy Saturday June 22<sup>nd</sup> 7.30pm

Canterbury Choral Society and the Youth Choir will perform Britten's *Company of Heaven* and Vaughan Williams's *Lark Ascending* and *An Oxford Elegy* at Canterbury Cathedral on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 7.30pm. They are marking the centenary of the birth of Benjamin Britten, probably the finest of all British Composers. *Company of Heaven* was originally composed for the BBC and was first broadcast in 1937 at the outbreak of war – it was lost for 50 years and rediscovered in the 1990's and performed at Aldeburgh. Many famous poets and writers text is contained within the piece including words by John Milton, John Ruskin, Emily Bronte and William Blake.

Lark Ascending was sketched by Vaughan Williams whilst watching troop ships cross the English Channel at the outbreak of the first world war. He was observed and arrested as he was thought to be jotting down secret code. The work was premiered in London in 1921 and conducted by Sir Adrian Boult. The piece is probably one most popular works ever – chosen by Desert Island Discs as its number one choice and by Classic FM audience on two occasions as the most popular piece of Classical Music. The solo violinist for this piece will be Juliette Roos, one of the String Finalists in the 2012 BBC Young Musicians of the Year. An Oxford Elegy also has some narration and some of the text is from Matthew Arnold's *The Scholar Gypsy* and *Thyrsis*.

Soloists for this concert will be Nazan Fikret who studied at The Guildhall School of Music and Drama. She made her operatic debut at the age of thirteen as Flora in Britten's The Turning of the Screw which she also played for her debut performance at The English National Opera in the acclaimed David McVicar Production.

The tenor roles will be sung by Bradley Smith, recently graduated from St John's College, Cambridge. During his time there he was appointed as Musical Director of the internationally renowned ensemble The Gentlemen of St John's.
