



A resident had raised concern over the amount of smoke in the village from a bonfire in May. FROM WYE BENEFICE

Diversity is a strength in any community – and on the whole we appreciate it, although most of us struggle when we are completely out of our comfort zone. Our local community comprises a number of distinct groups and the more overlap there is between them, the richer our communal life is.

Although community is organic, we usually set up structures to support its life. This is a bit like coral that secretes exquisitely beautiful hard carbonate exoskeletons which support and protect the living coral. Many of us have enjoyed the recent TV programme about the Great Barrier Reef. Sometimes our structures, initially set up to protect and enable an organic community to function, end up being not quite right for the job any more as life changes, and occasionally they even stifle the very life they are there to enhance.

A church (the people not the building) is also an organic body but as is very obvious we set up quite elaborate organisational structures (perhaps particularly in the Church of England!) and inevitably these sometimes become dated or unhelpful for life as it is now. In June, after long discussions and deliberations, some changes finally took place in how we organise ourselves within our Benefice (group of eight churches). These changes may appear to be merely bureaucracy gone mad but actually they partly reflect the current situation more accurately and are also designed to better enable us to function as living and growing communities.

So, the United Wye Benefice is now made up as follows:

Down the Hill we have

The Parish of Wye with Hinxhill; the church building at Hinxhill will continue to be used for worship and weddings but is no longer a parish church.

The Parish of Brook as before.

The Parish of Boughton Aluph and Eastwell as before.

The Parish of Petham as before.

The Parish upon the Hill; a new parish made up of the old parishes of Hastingleigh, Waltham and Elmsted with their three churches all as parish churches.

This all means that Ravi is now the Rector of the Benefice, although I am sure we will continue to call him the vicar, and Linda Cross is now Associate Priest in the Benefice. Alan Ramsay's title is unaffected by any of these changes.

Communities of Christians worldwide and locally are described as a Body – and for this, diversity is not an ideal but is essential. Without diversity a body is a monstrosity and useless. So, as we go forward with our new structures let's celebrate the different 'characteristics' of our various churches, recognising that these are essential if we are to serve our wider community effectively.

THE PREVENTION OF ALZHEIMER'S

On Saturday Sept. 27th I have invited Patrick Holford, a leading advocate of Optimal Nutrition, author of many books and Director of 'Food for the Brain' (FFB), to speak at Penstock Hall Barn, Brabourne. His talk will include the work of FFB, with special reference to the Prevention of Dementia, and especially to its form as Alzheimer's.

There has been great interest in this subject recently, since senior politicians from many nations met in Britain this year and decided that the problem must be confronted world-wide by every possible means.

However, since drugs have not been able to make much progress in affecting the course of this disease, FFB decided to concentrate on Prevention. FFB has much experience in treating mental problems, such a Schizophrenia, by Nutrition, for several years at its Brain Bio Centre in London.

In 1986/87, while qualifying as a nutritionist at The Institute for Optimum Nutrition, then run by Patrick, I learnt first-hand from the brilliant doctors, the American Carl Pfeiffer and the Canadian Abram Hoffer. Both these psychiatrists had turned to nutrition to wean their Schizophrenia patients off drugs, and obtained cures far in excess of anyone else before or since.

Can we now apply these achievements to Dementia? There is indeed hope that we can.

At Oxford University, Prof David Smith has demonstrated, using EEG scans, that one method of Dementia prevention is by lowering the levels of Homocysteine in the body. Patrick will include details of this as one of at least six methods of keeping Dementia at bay.

I hope that by coming to this event you will gain some very useful knowledge for yourself, your family, and your friends.

HASTINGLEIGH WITH ELMSTED W.I.

Hastingleigh with Elmsted W.I. met on Thursday 5th of June at Evington Hall.

Fifteen members attended our meeting.

Our speaker this month was Eileen Jennings, who spoke to us on the subject of 'Walking the pilgrim trail to Santiago de Compostela'. St. James was a disciple of Jesus and legend says that he went to Spain. He is meant to be buried inland from Corunna. A church was built there after a body was found c.800 A.D. Mrs Jennings planned to take six weeks to complete the trail, starting on the French side of the Pyrenees and hoped to cover fifteen miles a day. There weren't any hotels on the route so walkers took sleeping bags and used refuges. They were only allowed to use them for one night before moving to the next one. Her first night was spent in a hostel at a monastery where she was given a blessing by a monk that had been used for one thousand years. Unfortunately it rained every single day of her walk, and as her most important piece of laundry was her socks, she was advised to use nappy pins and to pin them on her rucksack when she was walking to give them a chance to dry! She got a certificate when she arrived at her destination and stayed in a bed and breakfast that night - she said that the shower and hairwash she had after six weeks of walking were so good, she did it twice. Mrs Jennings spoke to us without a photographic presentation, but she evoked images of a beautiful and thoughtful experience.

Our President told us that unfortunately our team had won the wooden spoon at our last quiz evening. We hope to do better next time.

The competition was won by Mrs Helmer and the flower of the month was won by Mrs Pearson.

Our next meeting will be held on Thursday 3rd of July at 19:30, in Evington Hall. Our speaker's subject is 'Looking back to the sixties' and any new members would be made most welcome.

Wye Patient Participation Group—The role of the hospice

The recent publicity over the possible closure of the Pilgrims Hospice in Canterbury and the consequent public concern has highlighted how essential the hospice movement is to our society. This hospice is one of three run by the Pilgrims Hospice Trust in East Kent, the others are in Ashford and Thanet. It was as recently as 1967 that the modern hospice movement began in the UK. There are now over 200 hospices including 29 for children and three that are exclusively for HIV/AIDS patients. These independent hospices provide 80% of the palliative care (alleviate without curing) beds in the UK. The vast majority of their income is derived from charities and Trusts.

Hospices provide care for the whole person and family, and this includes physical, emotional, social, spiritual and psychological support. These services are provided by a range of specialists but also by a large number of volunteers. Generally each hospice has three times as many volunteers as specialists.

Although Hospices offer a wide range of care services, the main ones are pain relief and symptom control. These may be provided in the hospice but they can also be at home or in nursing homes. Wherever the care is given the emphasis is on ensuring patients retain the power of choice regarding the nature of their care. Preserving their dignity is paramount.

Hospices are expensive to run. In the case of our local Pilgrims Hospice the costs are more than £10.5 million a year. About 25% of this money comes from the NHS. The rest is by public donation. Providing more hospice care in the communities is the current approach and locally involves some 50 staff and volunteers.

Hospice care is available to anyone, with an advancing and potentially terminal illness, who is likely to benefit from the skills of the hospice care team and the care environment. Most patients are referred for hospice care by their GP or hospital doctor. A district nurse may also make a referral. It is important to remember that this care can be provided in the home as well as in the hospice or nursing home.

Marie Curie nurses, available throughout the U.K, also care for people in the last few weeks or months of their lives. They are generally requested through the district nurse.


