Dear Friends,

By the time you read this, the weeks of electioneering will be over and the result of the General Election will be known. Whether we voted or not, it is obvious that we cannot avoid the political decisions of both the electorate and the Government. Although many of the decisions of Parliament do not affect our everyday lives they do have a slow, accumulative effect upon the social fabric of the nation. 





Time for another evening of laughter

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

As you are all probably aware I have taken over from Trevor as your Neighbourhood watch Co-ordinator. Each month I will try and keep you up to date with the latest crime trends that may be applicable in a rural environment. The following excerpt is from the monthly bulletin that I receive from the Kent Police, not necessarily a rural problem, but an important one nevertheless.

CHECK YOUR CREDIT CARD STATEMENTS CAREFULLY

Jargon is constantly developing in all areas of our lives. Those of us with computers are well aware of this. Crime is no different. Just watch one of those many cop fiction programmes on the telly to hear this. Blagging (robbery), screwing a drum (house burglary) and biking (making off without paying for goods or services) are just a few.

The newest that I have heard of is "skimming". This relates to the reprogramming of the magnetic strip on bank and credit cards to give false information. Kent Police have a Cheque and Credit Card Unit as part of the Specialist Crime Department and are warning the public to carefully go through statements to make sure every item on there is genuine.

Rewriting the computer data on a card means that, because the name, account number and expiry date on the front and the signature are unchanged, the card looks legitimate. The "skimmed" card is then used to buy goods but the person charged will be whoever is unfortunate enough to have had their details coded into the metallic strip on the back.

Detective Superintendent Clapperton from Police HQ said, "Skimming is an offence that has become more prevalent because the card technology has become more readily available to commercial outlets and subsequently to the criminals. It isn't just banks which issue cards now, there are more and more cards around from commercial companies and criminals are using it to their advantage. If the fraudsters get hold of lists of credit card numbers, the potential for deception on a large scale is enormous".

So the advice is firstly look after your cards to prevent them being stolen and always carefully check your monthly statements. Your card may have never been out of your wallet or purse all month but if your strip details are on another card, the items will show on the statement. If you have a busy account, take even more care.

The credit card companies do hold spending profiles of your normal usage so if there is suddenly a great increase in activity in your account, especially away from your usual spending locations, they should pick this up and query it with you. Always let them know of unusual transactions which show up.

Our Hidden Heritage V

As I wrote in my last article, the arrival of the 'Neo-classical' style of architecture in building during the 17th century, coupled with increasing affluence in society, made building increasingly fashionable. It must be remembered that old was definitely "old hat", and that rebuilding and re-facing was the "in thing" to do! Date plaques were used to remind the neighbours of this, and there are authenticated instances where contemporary dates were inscribed on buildings erected somewhat earlier! This era saw the arrival of Mathematical Tiles. Mathematical or Brick Tiles, are a flanged tile designed to imitate brickwork. Bedded and nailed to timber framing or to brickwork, and with the joints pointed in with mortar, they are almost impossible to distinguish from true brickwork except to the trained eye. Becoming widely used by the mid 18th century, they made a useful cladding to modernise your timber frame house, or to give the impression you have a brick house when you can only afford a wooden one! Confined mainly to towns and large villages in the South East of England, there are many examples to be seen. In Canterbury there are houses in the Cathedral precinct, Ask Restaurant St.Peter's Street, Berni Inn Burgate to name three among dozens of others. Faversham, Sandwich, Tenterden and Rye all have a multitude of tile clad buildings. The tiles are predominantly of buff or yellow colour to the east, and mainly red to the west of the County. In Lewes and Brighton, a black glazed tile laid in header bond is the preferred colour. Nearer home, the School House, East Hill, Ashford is a fine buff tile example, also incorporating a stone string course at first floor level. Even closer, there are some nice red tile clad cottages in Church Street, Wye. To detect these tiles, study the building's external angles, there is usually a strip of timber fixed to the angle to which the tiles abut. Look closely at the arches, these are made of a slab of fired clay with the arch brick joints incised and pointed in to match the other

work. Where wooden buildings are tile clad, a close inspection at ground level will sometimes reveal buckled tiling where the structure has decayed and settled. (The Linen House, West Cross, Tenterden has this problem.) Further embellishments were the introduction if imitation stone quoins, (corner stones) made of wood and built into the tiling. An example is the Laura Ashley shop in Tenterden. The inventor and origin of this very versatile building component is unknown, the first dated tiles appeared in 1724, and since that time until the 19th century they were widely used. Two major houses in Kent have been Mathematically tiled: Chevening near Westerham, tiled clad for fashion sake and now restored to its original red brickwork, and Belmont at Eastling, built by Samuel Wyatt in 1722, still resplendent in its buff tile facades. Mathematical tiles are a unique method of building, and for me the subject has become a great interest. All likely buildings I see come under close scrutiny in the endeavour to ascertain the true nature of their fabric. Doubtless I have raised queries in the minds of passers-by when I have been observed peering at a house wall just inches from the end of my nose! Next month I will discuss the late Georgian- Victorian period, meanwhile, what about a visit to Belmont? Open to the public, marvellous house and grounds, fascinating collection of clocks and a tea room!


Bodsham in Spring

We reap this blessed morn.






CANTORES DOMINICAE


