



My dear Friends

"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain". So wrote St Paul, probably in the spring of 54AD as he stayed in Ephesus. He wrote those words because there were those who disputed that Jesus rose from the dead. Today, there are many, both within the church and outside who enjoy refuting that the resurrection happened.

Yet without the resurrection, there is only vanity - the vanity of great buildings, of cathedrals and churches, the vanity of great music, literature and art, the vanity of men and women through the centuries who lived and died for their faith in the risen Lord. If there is not resurrection, then there is only a deceitful hoax - a faith without substance.

"We bring the good news: What God promised to our fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children, by raising up Jesus" - again St Paul, but this time speaking to the curious in Antioch. By His death on the cross, Jesus frees us from the guilt of sin, by the power of the resurrection, he opens up the way to a new life - a life where there is a purpose. It is a deep sense of joy and freedom which comes from God's acceptance of us as we are, living under his mercy and forgiveness within a community of love.

May the power of the risen Lord touch your lives this Easter.


PANCAKE PARTY



Hope to see you during the coming season.






HASTINGLEIGH PARISH COUNCIL





FROM DAVE POLLARD (COMMUNITY INSPECTOR, NORTH WEALD)

What is the latest word in Police Jargon? This may be a new one even to avid viewers of "The Bill" - 'Hawkeye'! It may bring back memories, to those old enough to remember, of an old Cowboy and Indian TV programme of the 1960's but apart from ambushing the bad guys that is where the similarity ends.

Hawkeye is a sophisticated system that has been developed by Kent Police over the last couple of years to address public disorder and criminality in particular areas. It is now making its presence felt in the Weald, to some peoples extreme surprise!

OK then what is it? The answer is that it is a mixture of things, a mixture of signs and cameras. Hawkeye is used to observe and detect offences caused by disorderly and criminally minded people. The system operates by using a combination of signs, clearly mounted cameras and some very small hidden cameras. The system is, however, a combination of all these. For example the signs may be there by themselves, the hidden cameras may be there by themselves or the whole set may be present but spread throughout the whole problem area. It is a mobile system that is moved around easily and often. It is placed where the need is, throughout the area, and there are a multiple of cameras ready for use.

The benefit of Hawkeye is in it being a mixture of equipment and not seeing it doesn't mean it isn't there! Some excellent arrests for offences have occurred before any obvious signs of its presence have been seen. On occasions, however, what has been recorded on film has not warranted arrests. On some of these occasions we have taken the opportunity to let parents see what their children have been up to. The response to this course of action has been very positive. It is true a picture does paint a thousand words, or in the words of the song 'the camera never lies'.

HYMN WRITER OF THE MONTH

This month celebrates the birth of a well loved poet: George Herbert. b Montgomery, 3 April 1593. d 1632/3.

HYMN: 194 King of glory, King of peace, I will love thee; and, that love will never cease, I will move thee.

Thou hast granted my request, Thou has heard me;
Thou didst note my working breast, Thou has spared me

George Herbert was one of a group of poets who contributed to the rich flowering of English poetry in the seventeenth century.

Herbert came from an ancient and titled family. His scholastic abilities enabled him to pursue a brilliant career at Cambridge, eventually becoming public orator of the University. His immediate intention had not been to enter the Church, although in his undergraduate days he had intimated to his mother that he had dedicated his poetic gift to God. Before seeking ordination in the Church of England he used his connections to gain access to the Court of James I. He also represented Montgomery in Parliament in 1624 and 1625. When events of the State tumbled about Herbert's head, he was led from the secular path, ordained deacon and, in 1626, installed as a canon of Lincoln Cathedral with the post of prebendary of Leighton Bromswold, Huntingdonshire. It was at nearby Little Gidding that Herbert renewed his friendship with Nicholas Ferrar. This became an influential period in Herbert's life.

Ferrar had set up his community consisting of his family and other friends for the purposes of living out a Christian rule of life, with simplicity, devotion and charitable works as its hallmarks. It demonstrated what in essence and spirituality the Church of England ideally should be - all within the constraints (and inspiration!) of the Book of Common Prayer. It stood as a bulwark against all that had been happening in a century dominated by various factions which had deeply eroded what some regarded as the true principles of Anglicanism.

In 1630, now fully ordained and married, Herbert removed to Bemerton in Wiltshire as its rector. It has been recorded that ploughmen would stop work in the fields when they heard Mr Herbert's bell ring for the daily times of prayer. It was here that Herbert wrote 'A Priest to the Temple', a prose work subtitled 'The Country Parson, His Character and Rule of Holy Life'. Throughout the years, though, Herbert had been writing his religious verses. In 1632 he become consumptive, and realising he had little time to live, he sent his book of poems to Ferrar requesting him to publish them. The volume appeared under the title 'The Temple' a year after Herbert's death and remains part of our literary heritage and an aid to Christian devotion.

The hymn 'King of glory, King of peace' is one of the poems taken from 'The Temple'. Two other well known hymns come from the same source - 'Let all the world in every corner sing', and 'Teach me, my God and King'. They were never intended for public hymn singing. In Herbert's day hymns as we know them had not properly arrived. A congregation in Herbert's time would have used the 1559 Prayer Book, and their 'hymn book' would have been the metrical book of Psalms. It was the influence of John Wesley in the following century that led to the adaptation of some of Herbert's verses. In order to fit the metrical tunes some were severely mutilated by Wesley - a rather hypocritical act on his part since he and his brother Charles were strict about others editing their hymns. Today, however, our hymn books have printed genuine Herbert!

'King of glory'..... first appeared in Wellington College Hymn Book, 1902, then passed into general usage through the English Hymnal.

It is the statutory role of the Community Health Councils to reflect the interests of the local population in matters relating to the National Health Service and they would, therefore, encourage people to put forward alternative suggestions if they do not agree with the proposals. If it is not satisfied that the proposals are capable of meeting the area's future health needs, the CHCs are obliged to appeal to the Secretary of State for Health and submit detailed counter proposals.

The CHCs will be looking very closely at the delivery, quality and access to patient services across the area, irrespective of site. There are many areas for immediate concern which will be reviewed and questioned in detail.

As part of the consultation process, the CHCs will host a series of public meetings to enable local residents to hear details of the proposals, comment upon them and raise any queries and concerns they may have.
